
**TEST CIRCUIT 1 AVALANCHE CAPABILITY**







**TEST CIRCUIT 2 SWITCHING TIME**




**TEST CIRCUIT 3 GATE CHARGE**




TYPICAL CHARACTERISTICS (T<sub>A</sub> = 25°C)




FORWARD TRANSFER CHARACTERISTICS




DRAIN CURRENT vs. DRAIN TO SOURCE VOLTAGE




FORWARD TRANSFER ADMITTANCE vs. DRAIN CURRENT




DRAIN TO SOURCE ON-STATE RESISTANCE vs. GATE TO SOURCE VOLTAGE











DRAIN TO SOURCE ON-STATE RESISTANCE vs. DRAIN CURRENT



GATE CUT-OFF VOLTAGE vs. CHANNEL TEMPERATURE










**Remark** The diode connected between the gate and source of the transistor serves as a protector against ESD. When this device actually used, an additional protection circuit is externally required if a voltage exceeding the rated voltage may be applied to this device.

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
