






# DERATING FACTOR OF FORWARD BIAS SAFE OPERATING AREA






# DRAIN CURRENT vs. DRAIN TO SOURCE VOLTAGE






# GATE CUT-OFF VOLTAGE vs. CHANNEL TEMPERATURE




FORWARD TRANSFER ADMITTANCE vs. DRAIN CURRENT








## DRAIN TO SOURCE ON-STATE RESISTANCE vs. GATE TO SOURCE VOLTAGE




# DRAIN TO SOURCE ON-STATE RESISTANCE vs. CHANNEL TEMPERATURE




#### CAPACITANCE vs. DRAIN TO SOURCE VOLTAGE




