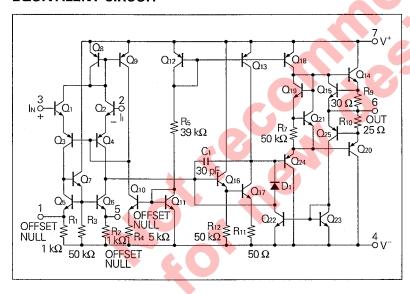
DESCRIPTION

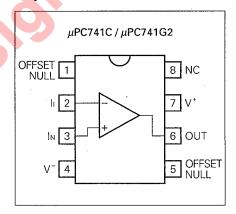

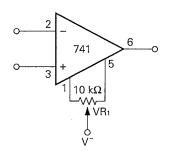

OFFSET VOLTAGE NULL CIRCUIT



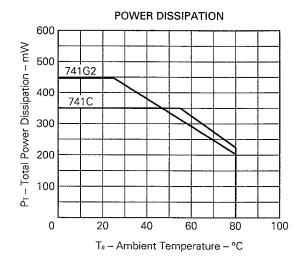


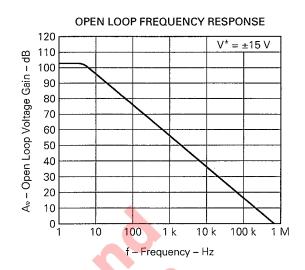
